

## The Word of the Lord

### Lessons of the Day

First Lesson: 1 Kings 19:15-16,19-21

Reader: A reading from the first book of Kings.  
The Lord said to Elijah, "Go, return on your way to the wilderness of Damascus; when you arrive, you shall anoint Hazael as king over Aram. Also you shall anoint Jehu son of Nimshi as king over Israel; and you shall anoint Elisha son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah as prophet in your place." So he set out from there, and found Elisha son of Shaphat, who was plowing. There were twelve yoke of oxen ahead of him, and he was with the twelfth. Elijah passed by him and threw his mantle over him. He left the oxen, ran after Elijah, and said, "Let me kiss my father and my mother, and then I will follow you." Then Elijah said to him, "Go back again; for what have I done to you?" He returned from following him, took the yoke of oxen, and slaughtered them; using the equipment from the oxen, he boiled their flesh, and gave it to the people, and they ate. Then he set out and followed Elijah, and became his servant.

The Word of the Lord.

*People: Thanks be to God.*

Officiant: Please join me in reciting Psalm 16 responding on the italicized verses.

1 Protect me, O God, for I take refuge in you; \*

I have said to the Lord, "You are my Lord, my good above all other."

*2 All my delight is upon the godly that are in the land, \*  
upon those who are noble among the people.*

3 But those who run after other gods \*  
shall have their troubles multiplied.

*4 Their libations of blood I will not offer, \*  
nor take the names of their gods upon my lips.*

5 O God, you are my portion and my cup; \*  
it is you who uphold my lot.

*6 My boundaries enclose a pleasant land; \*  
indeed, I have a goodly heritage.*

7 I will bless the Lord who gives me counsel; \*  
my heart teaches me, night after night.

*8 I have set the Lord always before me; \*  
because he is at my right hand I shall not fall.*

9 My heart, therefore, is glad, and my spirit rejoices; \*  
my body also shall rest in hope.

*10 For you will not abandon me to the grave, \*  
nor let your holy one see the Pit.*

11 You will show me the path of life; \*  
in your presence there is fullness of joy, and in your right hand are pleasures for  
evermore.

## Second Reading

Galatians 5:1,13-25

Reader: A reading from the letter to the Galatians.

For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery. For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." If, however, you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another. Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the flesh. For what the flesh desires is opposed to the Spirit, and what the Spirit desires is opposed to the flesh; for these are opposed to each other, to prevent you from doing what you want. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not subject to the law. Now the works of the flesh are obvious: fornication, impurity, licentiousness, idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these. I am warning you, as I

warned you before: those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit.

Gospel

Luke 9:51-62

Deacon: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

*People: Glory to you, Lord Christ.*

Deacon: When the days drew near for Jesus to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem. And he sent messengers ahead of him. On their way they entered a village of the Samaritans to make ready for him; but they did not receive him, because his face was set toward Jerusalem. When his disciples James and John saw it, they said, "Lord, do you want us to command fire to come down from heaven and consume them?" But he turned and rebuked them. Then they went on to another village. As they were going along the road, someone said to him, "I will follow you wherever you go." And Jesus said to him, "Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests; but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head." To another he said, "Follow me." But he said, "Lord, first let me go and bury my father." But Jesus said to him, "Let the dead bury their own dead; but as for you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God." Another said, "I will follow you, Lord; but let me first say farewell to those at my home." Jesus said to him, "No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God."

## *Reception, Reaffirmation and Renewal of Baptismal Vows*

**Presentation and Examination of the Candidates**

Bishop: The Candidates will now be presented.

Presenter: I present **Lisa Frankel-Boerner** to be received into this Communion.

Presenter: I present **Nanci Gordon** who desires to reaffirm her baptismal vows.

Bishop: Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil?

Candidates: I do.

Bishop: Do you renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?

Candidates: I do, and with God's grace I will follow him as my Savior and Lord.

*(After all have been presented, the Bishop addresses the congregation, saying)*

Bishop: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

*People: We will.*

## The Baptismal Covenant

Bishop: Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

Do you believe in God the Father?

*People: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.*

Bishop: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

*People: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.*

Bishop: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

*People: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.*

Bishop: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

*People: I will, with God's help.*

Bishop: Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

*People: I will, with God's help.*

Bishop: Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

*People: I will, with God's help.*

Bishop: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

*People: I will, with God's help.*

Bishop: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

*People: I will, with God's help.*

## Prayers for the Candidates

Bishop: Let us now pray for these persons who have renewed their commitment to Christ. Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

*People: God, hear our prayer.*

Bishop: Open their hearts to your grace and truth.

*People: God, hear our prayer.*

Bishop: Fill them with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

*People: God, hear our prayer.*

Bishop: Keep them in the faith and communion of your holy Church.

*People: God, hear our prayer.*

Bishop: Teach them to love others in the power of the Spirit.

*People: God, hear our prayer.*

Bishop: Send them into the world in witness to your love.

*People: God, hear our prayer.*

Bishop: Bring them to the fullness of your peace and glory.

*People: God, hear our prayer.*

Bishop: Almighty God, we thank you that by the death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ you have overcome sin and brought us to yourself, and that by the sealing of your Holy Spirit you have bound us to your service. Renew in these your servants the covenant you have made with them at their Baptism. Send them forth in the power of that Spirit to perform the service you set before them; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

#### For Reception

Bishop: Almighty and everlasting God, let your fatherly hand ever be over these your servants; let your Holy Spirit ever be with them; and so lead them in the knowledge and obedience of your Word, that they may serve you in this life, and dwell with you in the life to come; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

## The Holy Communion

### The Great Thanksgiving S 120

Bishop: God be with you.

*People: And also with you.*

Bishop: Lift up your hearts.

*People: We lift them to the Lord.*

Bishop: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*People: It is right to give God thanks and praise.*

Bishop: It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. In fulfillment of his true promise, the Holy Spirit came down from heaven, lighting upon the disciples, to teach them and to lead them into all truth; uniting peoples of many

tongues in the confession of one faith, and giving to your Church the power to serve you as a royal priesthood, and to preach the Gospel to all nations. Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

*All: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might.  
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.  
Hosanna in the highest.  
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.  
Hosanna in the highest.*

**Eucharistic Prayer B (People stand or kneel as able.)**

**Bishop:** We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

*All: Therefore, according to his command, O Father,  
We remember his death,  
We proclaim his resurrection,  
We await his coming in glory;*

**Bishop:** And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. AMEN.

Bishop: And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

*All: (Traditional version)*  
*Our Father, who art in heaven,*  
*hallowed be thy Name,*  
*thy kingdom come, thy will be*  
*done, on earth as it is in heaven.*  
*Give us this day our daily bread.*  
*And forgive us our trespasses, as we*  
*forgive those who trespass against us.*  
*And lead us not into temptation,*  
*but deliver us from evil.*  
*For thine is the kingdom, and*  
*the power, and the glory, for*  
*ever and ever. Amen.*

*(Contemporary version)*  
*Our loving God in heaven,*  
*holy is your Name,*  
*may your reign come, your will be*

People: *Therefore, let us keep the feast. Alleluia!*

**The Invitation**

Bishop: The Gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

*All may come up the center aisle to receive Communion. Alert an usher if you wish to receive communion in your seat. The priest will distribute the bread and the wine in "kits" that we will consume together once all are served. Those wishing to receive a blessing instead of Communion are invited to cross their arms as a signal to the priest. Also, communion in "one kind" (bread or wine alone) still constitutes the full receipt of Communion. Let those serving Communion know if this is your preference upon arrival to the railing.*
